Last year's Harvard applicant pool of 34,295 was one of the largest in Harvard's history, a slight decrease from last year's record pool of 35,023. The corresponding admission rate – 5.9% – is the most competitive in the history of the College. Locally, 191 Western Pennsylvania students sought admission, an increase of 7% from last year. We attracted talented applicants from more than 75 public and independent high schools, and a few who were schooled at home. Although many of the applicants reside in or near Pittsburgh, many others come from communities such as Slippery Rock, Greenville, Johnstown, Somerset, Hollidaysburg, Waynesburg, Bradford, and Uniontown.


Harvard Joint-Travel Stop in Pittsburgh October 7, 2014
